## PROJECT EXPERIENCE

### Renovation of Naval Base Building 73, San Diego, CA

Whitehorn Construction is presently serving as the prime contractor on a building renovation project with the US Navy at the 32nd Street Naval Station in San Diego, California. The full interior renovation of Building 73 includes the demolition of existing walls, abatement, doors and frames, flooring, restrooms and heating radiators. Whitehorn Construction will install new carpet and tile, doors, suspended ceiling, window coverings, a fire alarm and sprinkler system, and paint throughout the building. We will also install 10,500 linear feet of new conduit and boxes for cabling, telephone, and a fire alarm system. The project includes the renovation of office spaces, restrooms, and a kitchen area as well as painting the exterior of the building.



### Infrastructure Improvements U.S. Customs & Border Patrol, Calexico, CA

Whitehorn Construction is presently serving as the prime contractor on the infrastructure improvement project with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers/Department of Homeland Security. This project consists of infrastructure upgrades to a 3 acre temporary border patrol station. Several site amenities are being added to create a vehicle storage and minor maintenance repair yard. Site improvements include construction of a 2 station vehicle wash rack; construction of a secured tire changing station; installation of 2000 LF of perimeter security fencing; installation of 50,000 SF of aggregate base parking; underground electrical and propane distribution to support maintenance equipment; and grading and storm drainage upgrades.



### National POW/MIA Memorial at the National Cemetery at March ARB in Riverside, CA

In 2005, Loran Whitehorn served as the project manager for the design-build of the POW/MIA Memorial at the Riverside National Cemetery. The project included redesigning the landscaping, installing the memorial and a pre-built bridge, constructing and finishing the flatwork surrounding the memorial, and building the concrete slab around the memorial. One unique element of this construction was that the existing lake needed to be moved to accommodate the memorial. Mr. Whitehorn's team surveyed and regarded for appropriate drainage, and re-contoured the shape of the lake to fit the new design. Before construction could begin. Mr. Whitehorn's team worked with the Riverside National Cemetery Support Committee to gain approval for the design and construction plans through the U.S. Congress. To this day, visitors to the memorial are moved by the statue, inscriptions and surroundings.
